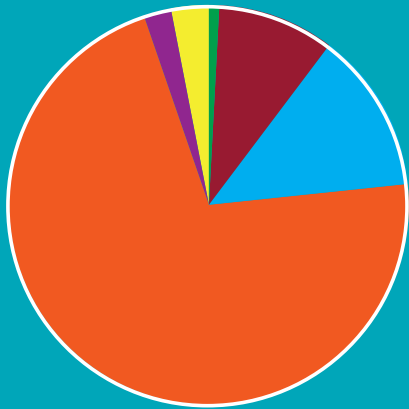

Our online application helps determine which categories of membership you qualify for and allows you to choose the one that best fits your needs. ASCO Member Categories:

- **Full Member:** Physicians treating oncology patients.
- **Full Member in Developing Countries:** Discounted Full membership is available to physicians who treat oncology patients and reside in a developing country as defined by the World Bank list of economies.
- **Full Member Early Career:** Discounted Full membership is available to physicians who treat oncology patients and have completed an oncology training program within the last 3 years.
- **Member in Training:** Free membership is available to physicians and other health professionals at the doctoral level who are participating in a subspecialty training program in oncology.
- **Allied Physician/Doctoral Scientist:** Physicians and other health professionals at the doctoral level or individuals with equivalent academic ranks who are not eligible for Full membership and who are primarily engaged in the biology, diagnosis, prevention, or treatment of human cancer.
- **Advanced Practice Provider:** Advanced practitioners in oncology, including physician assistants, nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, advanced degree nurses, and pharmacists.
- **Affiliated Health Professional:** Oncology professionals who do not hold doctoral-level degrees, including nurses, research assistants, and other health specialists.
- **Practice Administrator:** Individuals who monitor and supervise the business operations of an oncology medical practice, cancer center, or facility.
- **Patient Advocate:** Individuals who help people with cancer and their caregivers access accurate, reliable, and timely information about their disease and treatment options.
- **Student/Non-Oncology Resident:** Free membership is available to medical residents, medical students, graduate students, and undergraduate students.
